1. Minutes and Matters arising

- Minutes of last full meeting 30 Oct 2014 approved
- Senator Fiach MacConghail to be invited to meeting of the group to discuss the Abbey Theatre's contribution to the Decade of Centenaries.
- Wider distribution of available commemorative exhibitions countrywide to be explored
- Concerns considered regarding proportionality of broadcast coverage on RTE of the differing strands of commemorations.

2. Launch of Ireland.ie/2016 - Project Team

Project Team updated group on progress since the 12 November GPO launch by An Taoiseach of "Ireland 2016" and the pre-launch briefing of the group viz.

- Country-wide consultation process underway viz. CEO's of local authorities; Govt departments; civil society organisations; International partners in the UK and US to be included; ambassadorial interest abroad actively engaged; cultural institutions and the Arts Council engaged to provide events within tight budget constraints.
- Engagement with Expert Advisory Committee chaired by Dr. Maurice Manning;
- Submissions received being reviewed and prioritised according to largest impact per unit cost; group members encouraged to submit proposals;
- Draft programme planned to be available in Spring 2015
- The tight timeline for budgeting for 2016 events noted.
- North/South consultation regarding commemorations events to be dealt with under the auspices of the North/South Ministerial Council. Ministerial commitment noted to work on a cross border basis on commemorations.

"Ireland 2016" Launch event 12 November 2014

- Project team generally satisfied with launch event, pointing to the specific location chosen of the iconic GPO building and speeches emphasising the legacy associations.
- Security around such events to be kept under review with relevant authorities.
- Group advised that professional translators have been engaged for the Irish language version of the Ireland.ie website.
- Ministerial commitment to engage with relatives' groups noted.

3. **Stamp programme for 2017**

- Outline of suggested themes for commemorative stamps for 2017 discussed.
- **4. Reports:** Some key events since the last meeting were noted:
- Armistice Day & Remembrance Sunday events;
- NLI "World War Ireland" exhibition launch (20 Nov)
- Book launches (*Women of the Irish Revolution*) and (*From Richmond Barracks to Keogh Square*) held at Richmond Barracks at which 150 and 350 attended.
- Launch of 2015 Schools History Competition.

5. Commemorations for 2015.

The three primary centenaries for 2015 anticipated to be:

- (i): The Gallipoli Campaign, centred on Anzac Day, 25 April
- (ii): Sinking of the Lusitania, May 2015
- (iii) O'Donovan Rossa funeral, 1 August 2015
- (iv) Consideration suggested for the 70^{th} anniversary of the liberation of Europe to be associated with the centenary commemorations.
- (v) Programme of events planned at Glasnevin Cemetery in 2015 noted. Work of Glasnevin Trust complemented.
- (vi) Group agreed on necessity for commemorative programme to reflect range of events occurring on the historic timeline during the year.
